This course provides a foundation in cultural competency. The objective of this course is to have students challenge their personal and cultural biases while learning about decolonized and alternative ways of knowing and engaging in healthcare. The course prioritizes cultural knowledge from Indigenous communities in the regions that CNC serves in Northern British Columbia, while providing groundwork for students to practice with more sensitivity, cultural humility, and respect for all cultures.

- Wanting to build skills and capacity for cultural humility
- Want to know more about culture awareness, cultural sensitivity, and cultural safety
